High School Report

Guest Speakers

January 19, 2010

Shelly Schlumpf introduced the program speaker, Bill Pugh, Public Works Director, City of Sumner. He started his ‘Water’ presentation by playing the Sons of the Pioneer, hit song (1947), *Cool, Clear, Water*. The City of Sumner has over 77 miles of pipe through which flow 620 million gallons of water per year to over three thousand customers and 727 fire hydrants. The average monthly use is thirty million gallons which rises during the months of August and September to sixty-eight million gallons. This peak demand is very close to what the City can get from its current supply. Working toward a fifty-year plan, they must look at supply including how to get more from their existing supply; increase spring production and new sources (Dieringer Well – need to increase the water rights but mitigation is required; New Central Well; with Mt View/Edgewood/Pacific). In addition, they must look at demand including ways to conserve through their water conservation program (cash rebate, free fixtures, landscaping and irrigation options) as it costs far less to conserve than it does to create a new supply. Currently, a request for proposal is out through the City to conduct a rate study. Bill conducted a question and answer period and awarded water conservation prizes to several Rotarians.
